

# Freedom



## Freedom

This is a simple square design using two basic shapes in different combinations. If you are new to blackwork this is an easy introduction to joining elements together.

If you enjoy working this piece try one of the larger designs in Blackwork Journey. They all use the same methods.

**Materials:**

14 count Aida, 8 x 8 inches

**Threads:**

DMC stranded cotton

310 Black, one skein

161 Grey blue, one skein.

Any other colour or remnants could be used.

**Tapestry needle No. 24**

Blunt needles make it much easier to penetrate the material.

**Stitches used:**

Back stitch

Cross stitch

**Method:**

Work from the centre outwards using one strand of cotton for the back stitch and two strands for the cross stitch.
