



# Flying Geese Part 2

## Flying Geese Part 2 Filler Patterns 1, 2 and 3

**Design Area:** 9.43 x 9.43 inches

**Stitches:** 139 x 139

**Fabric:** Zweigart 28 count evenweave or 14 count Aida, 14 x 14 inches. NB. If Aida fabric is used there may be some split blocks.

### Threads:

**Framework:** Cross stitch 2 strands of floss, two skeins, or Cotton P rle No.12, one ball. The framework needs to be a strong colour. The filler patterns will be fitted into the cross stitch and back stitch framework.

Rainbow Gallery Petite Treasure braid or DMC Metallic E3852 dark gold, or an alternative thread may be used to add sparkle and interest.

Mill Hill Glass Beads are optional. MHG 557Gold, one packet or alternative colour.

Tapestry Needle No.24

Small embroidery ring or frame

### Add Filler Patterns 1, 2 and 3.

#### Use one strand of floss.

The framework has been completed and it is now time to add the first three filler patterns. Choose colours you enjoy working with. They should be strong enough to show clearly on the fabric. If in doubt lay one strand across the fabric. If it does not make an impact choose a darker tone.


The design can also be worked in black and gold or black and copper, royal blue and gold or garnet as a red work design. The choice is yours!

#### Stitches used:

Back stitch, one strand

Cross stitch, two strands

Colonial knots or French knots, two strands



#### Method:

1. Follow the pattern sheet carefully. Complete each triangle in turn.
2. If metallic thread is included use short lengths to reduce fraying or use Rainbow Gallery Petite Treasure Braid which seldom frays.
3. Do not add beads until the end of the project. They are optional.

Next month patterns 4, 5 and 6 will be added.
